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Questions about the SafeCare Program?

Q: What is the cost of SafeCare services?

A: Free of charge.

Q: What are the benefits of SafeCare services?

- Creating positive relationships between caregivers and their children.
- Ensuring homes are safe to reduce the risk of child unintentional injury.
- Keeping children as healthy as possible.

Q: How often and how long are visits?

A: Visits are weekly in home or local community setting from 1 – 1½ hours.

Q: Who provides services?

A: A licensed trauma therapist.

Q: How long is the program?

A: Anywhere from 5-10 months.

Who Can Join?

- Families who are involved with Family Based Safety Services (FBSS), Our Community Our Kids (OCOK), or Conservatorship who are pregnant or parenting a child up to age five (5) years old.
- Families who are in monitored return who are pregnant or parenting a child up to age five (5) years old.
- Families who are involved with Family Recovery Court (FRC) who are pregnant or parenting a child up to age five (5) years old.
- Current or previous foster youth who are pregnant or parenting a child up to five (5) years old.
